

Cheat sheet altgr-weur

The 'ground rules':

- **diaeresis** (umlaut) versions **on** the key itself: a→ä e→ë i→ï o→ö u→ü
- **acute** versions **below-right** of key: z→á d→é k→í l→ó j→ú
- **grave** versions available **right** of key: s→à r→è p→ò (but m→ì and y→ù)
- **circumflex** versions **below grave** version x→â f→ê ;→ô h→û (but g→î)
- **tilde** versions next to each other on the **bottom row**: v→ã b→õ n→ñ
- some have '**logical**' places: w→æ (w is between a and e); q→å (Q is round); 8→ß (similar form); c→ç
- exceptions: t→ø .→œ m→ì y→ù g→î

Single quotes are (generally) used secondarily, eg. to stress or change the meaning of a word: Another 'fine' mess!
